6th Grade: First Meeting 1:30-2:30

These are suggestions only - please follow your own instincts - Be Yourself!

- 1. Introductions: possible activities- explain role of advisor, name games, get to know you warm-ups, snacks, folders. Ice breaker activity suggestions are in the blue crate in the copy room. (20 minutes or so...)
- 2. Collect permission slips and fees: these need to go to the office
- 3. Lockers: go over how to work rotary locks and assign lockers. You will get a list of your bank of lockers from the office which includes the combinations. (This tends to take a while...as much as 30 minutes for some.)
- 4. Go over schedule for the following day.

First meeting with 6th, 7th, and 8th Graders (Your entire House)

- 1. Introductions
- 2. Hand out planners -review planner innards...
- 3. Hand out schedules
- 4. Pair up 7/8th graders with 6th graders to write down their schedules in the planners
- 5. Collect schedules
- 6. Locker assignments for 7th and 8th graders 6th graders practice on their lockers
- 7. Students highlight their schedule on the school map in planner
- 8. 7th and 8th graders walk through the schedule for that day (red or white) with the 6th graders (around the building to find their classes...)
- -Snacks would be good at this point before they begin their class day... (no break this day)

Second day meeting with House

- 1. Fun activity
- 2. Debrief and questions from the previous day
- 3. Review M & Ms (majors and minors) Roosevelt's rules in the planner
- 4. Can have students fill out White Day schedule and then tour the building to find their rooms.
- 5. Possible activity: 7th and 8th graders offer helpful, supportive advise to 6th graders as a closing activity.
